The 1983-84 Cambridge High School annual is being dedicated to Mr. Milt Crapnell and Mr. Al Rumley. Each has been a major contributor to the students of Cambridge school system.

Mr. Crapnell has been on the staff of the Cambridge Schools for 25 of the past 27 years. He has had many teaching assignments during that period. The major portion of his time has been spent in the 7th and 8th grades as a math teacher and a supervisor and as the high school diversified occupation coordinator.

The high school diversified occupational program flourished under his guidance. He took over a floundering program and made it a very successful one. This has been an asset to our school and the community.

Mr. Crapnell will be remembered for his disciplined classrooms and his concern for his students. He was and is a committed, caring teacher and person.

Mr. Al Rumley taught science in the Cambridge Junior High School for all of his 27 years in the Cambridge schools. He also coached at the high school level in track and basketball.

Mr. Rumley's devotion to this age of students and his classes are exemplified by his years of service. It takes a special person to work with students of this age level. Mr. Rumley never altered his goal of providing the best education possible to these 7th and 8th grade students.

He will long be remembered as a teacher who was willing to go the extra mile and devote the extra time to any student. This contribution to his students was a benefit to the schools and the community.

Both Mr. Crapnell and Mr. Rumley will be missed, each in his own way. We wish them both the very best in their retirement years.

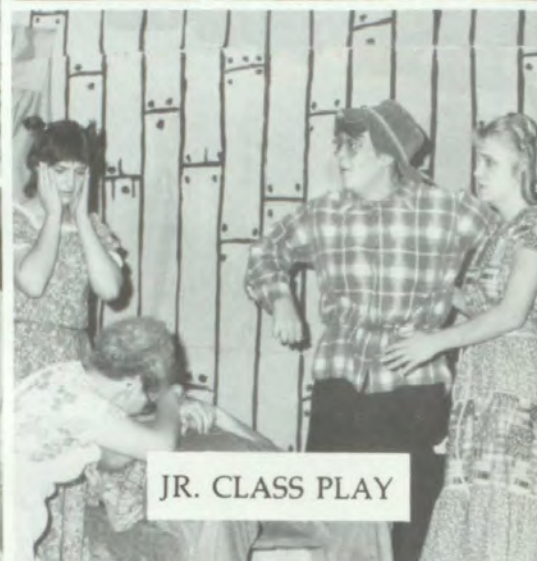

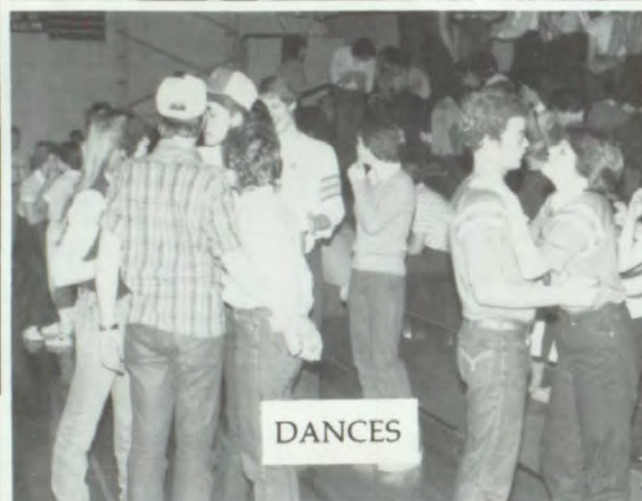

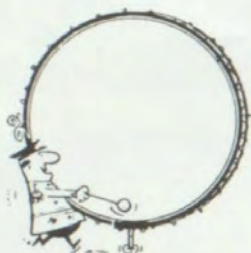

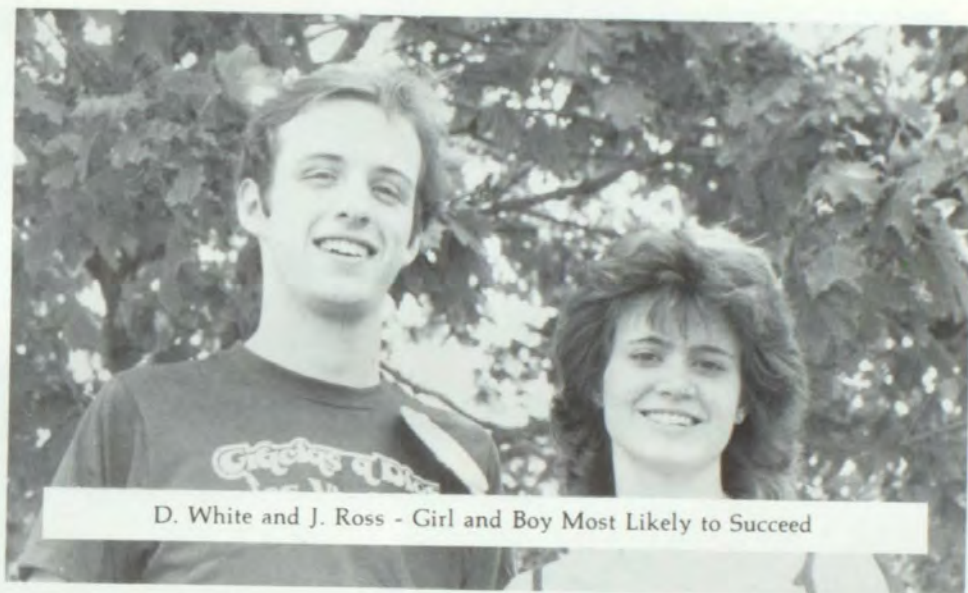

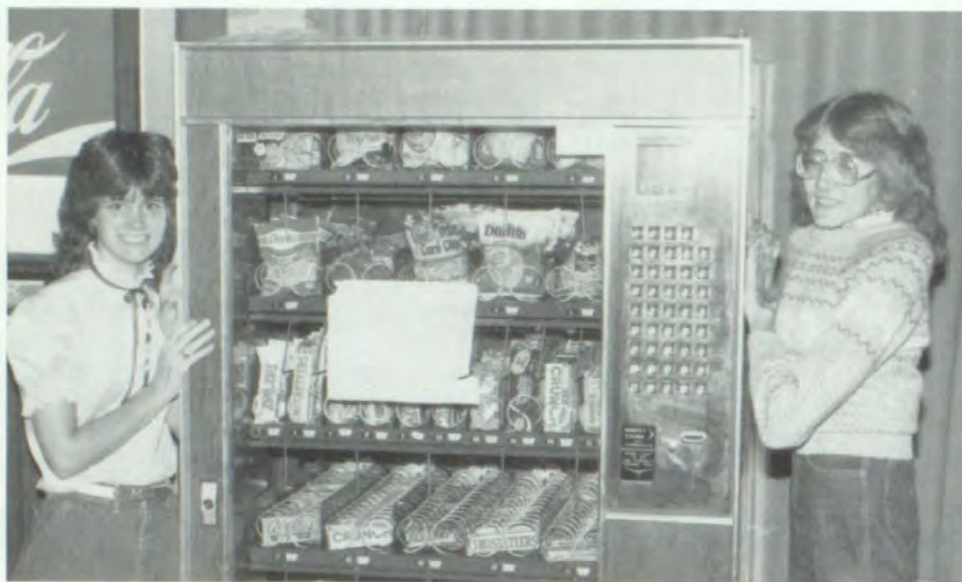

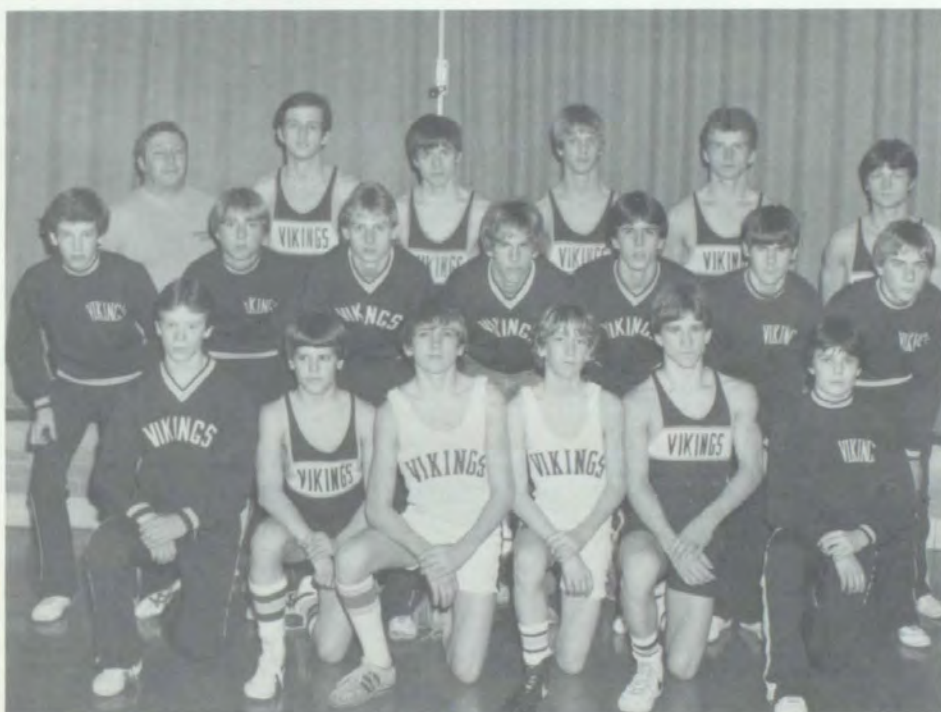
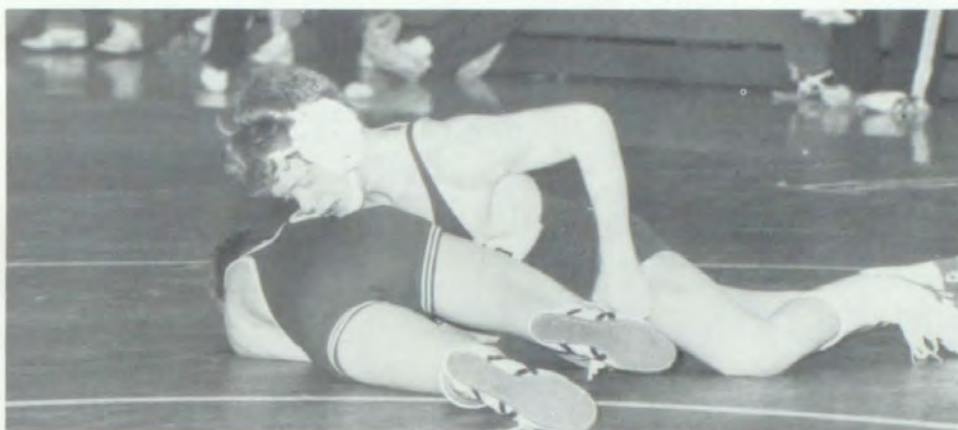

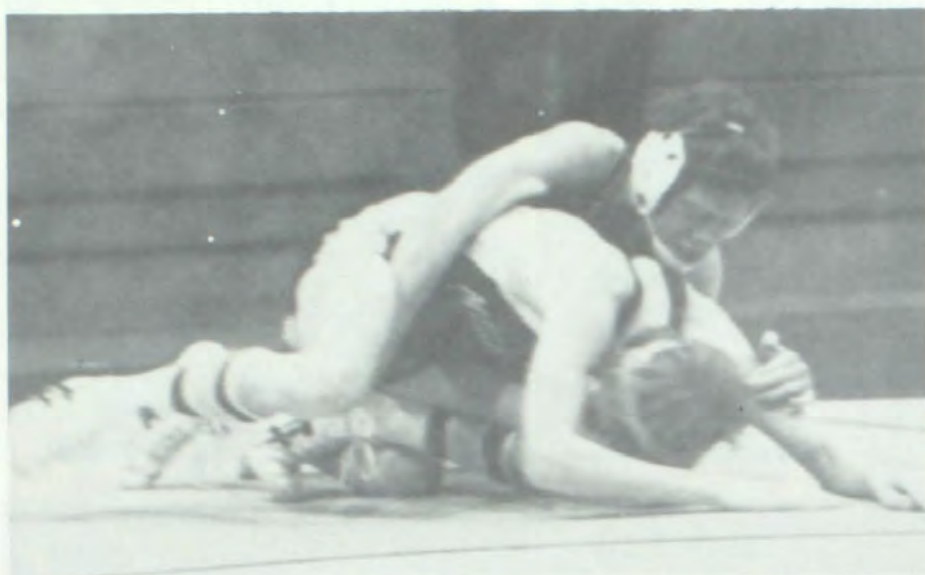
