


The ladies were dressed in bright colored dresses with their hair pulled back and the gentlemen had on their tuxedos, suspenders, and dancing shoes.

It didn't matter if you came as a couple, with friends, or as a group, a good time was had by all.






Mus Art










Choir

The Chess club was supervised by Mrs. Solberg. Any member was welcome to come and play a friendly game of chess.












Straw Vote
