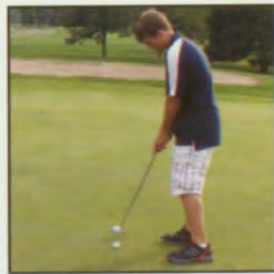

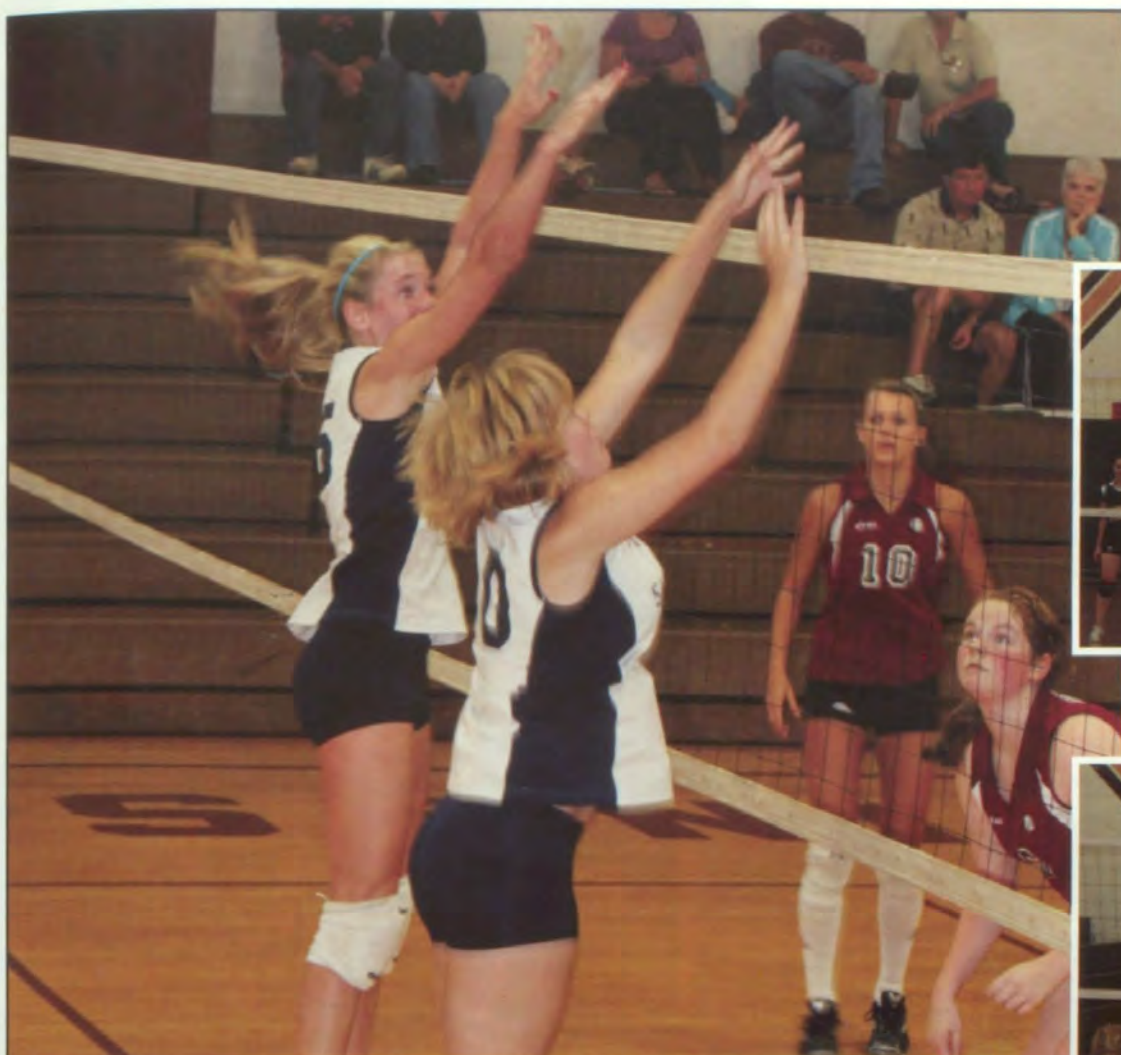

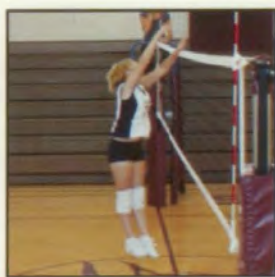

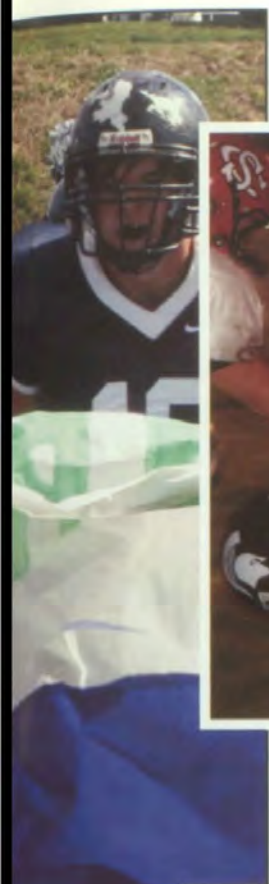

Dance

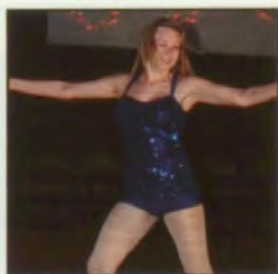

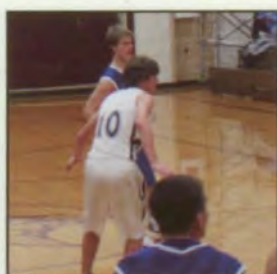

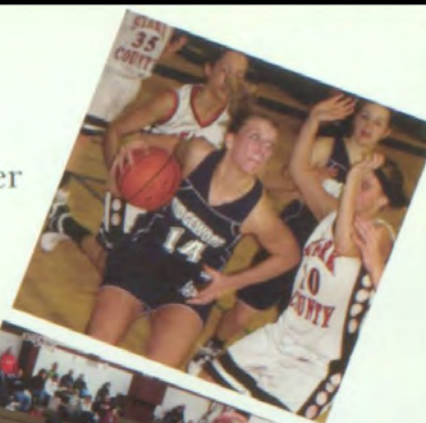

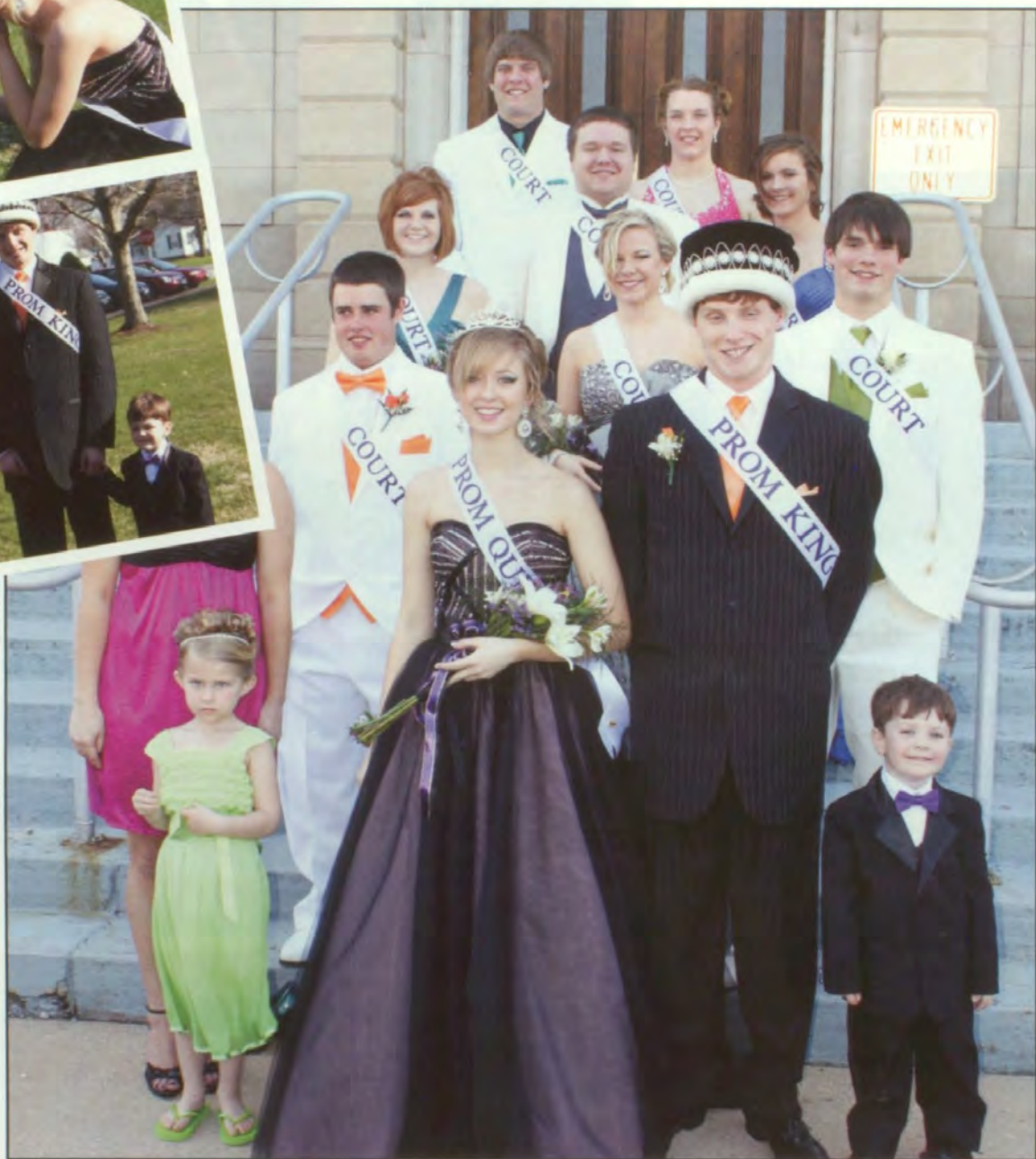
The ladies were dressed in bright colored dresses with their hair pulled back and the gentlemen had on their tuxedos, suspenders, and dancing shoes.

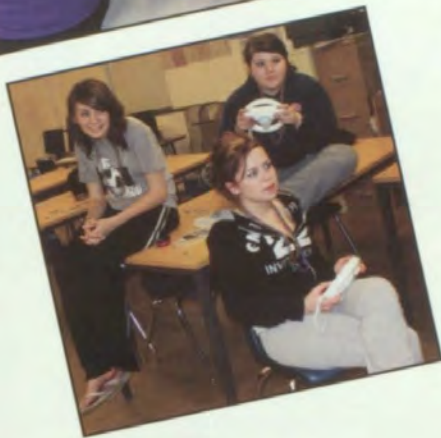

Annie the Musical



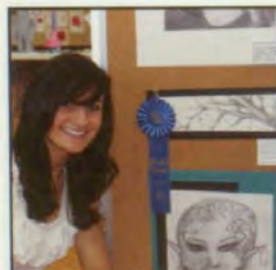

Mus Art



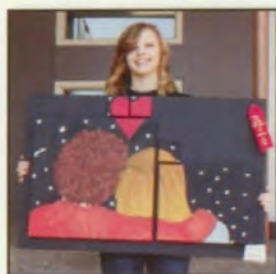
