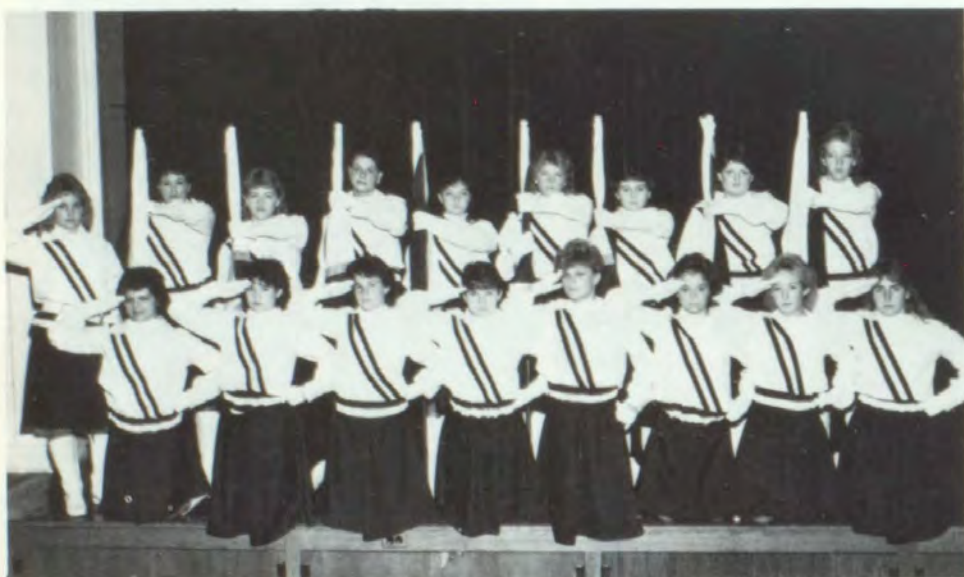

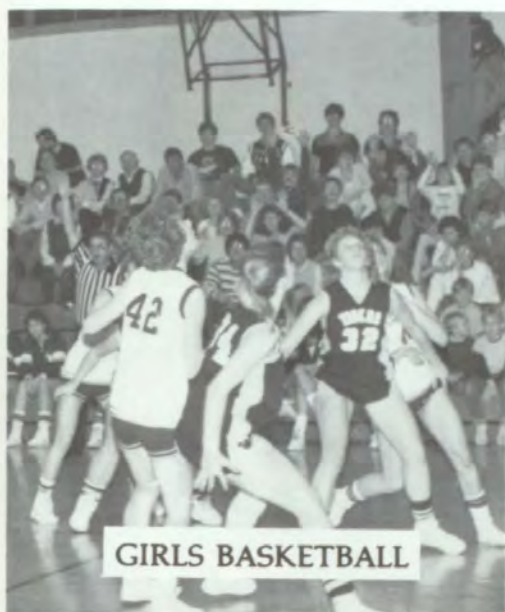

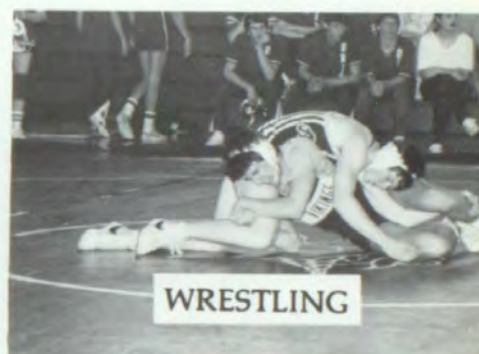

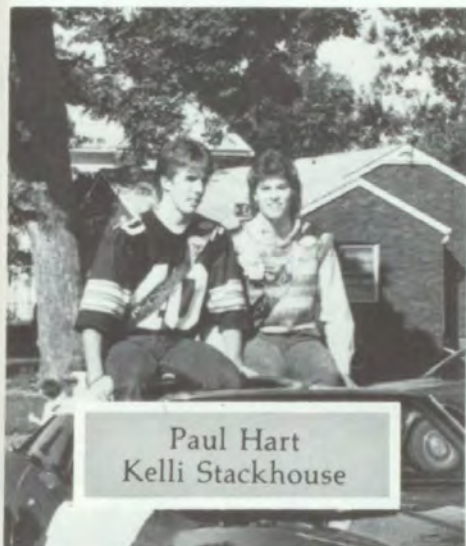

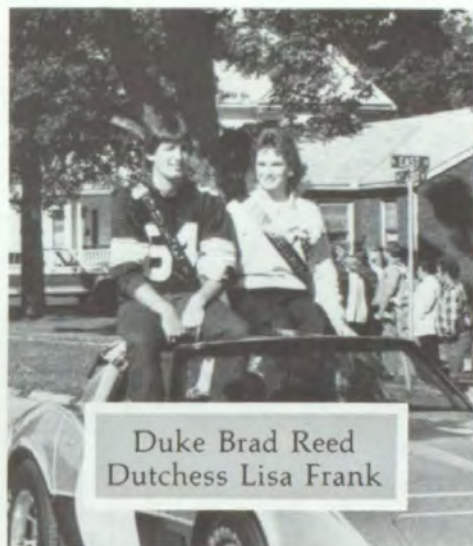
SPARK A HOMECOMING VICTORY



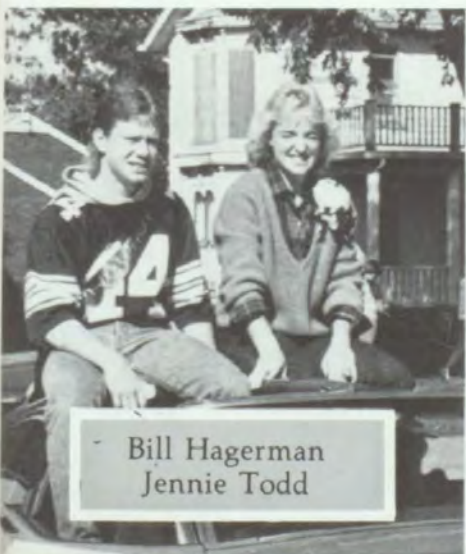

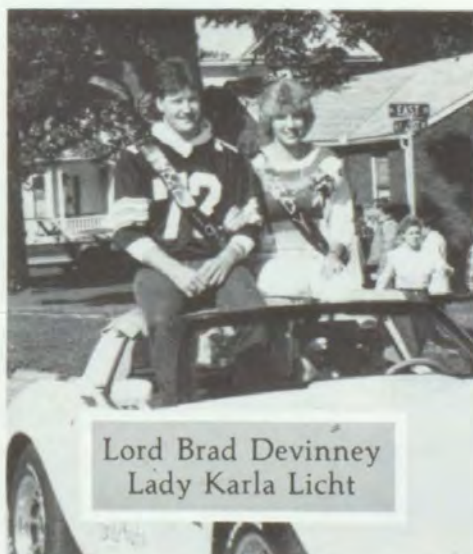

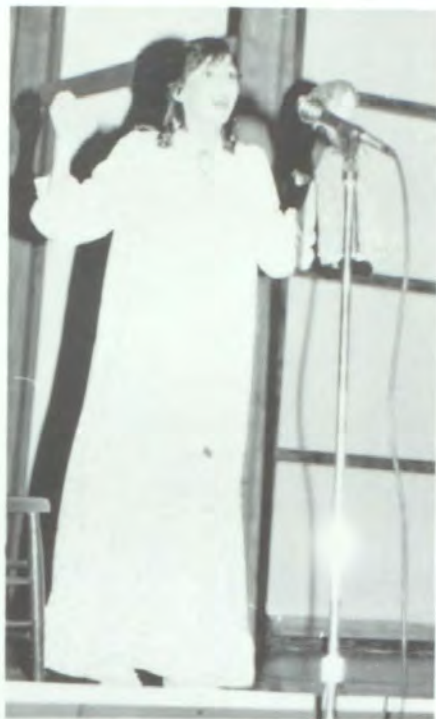

The golf team ended the year with an overall dual record of three wins and seven losses. Although officially, there is only a boys' team, for the first time, enough girls participated to qualify a team for the state tournament series. 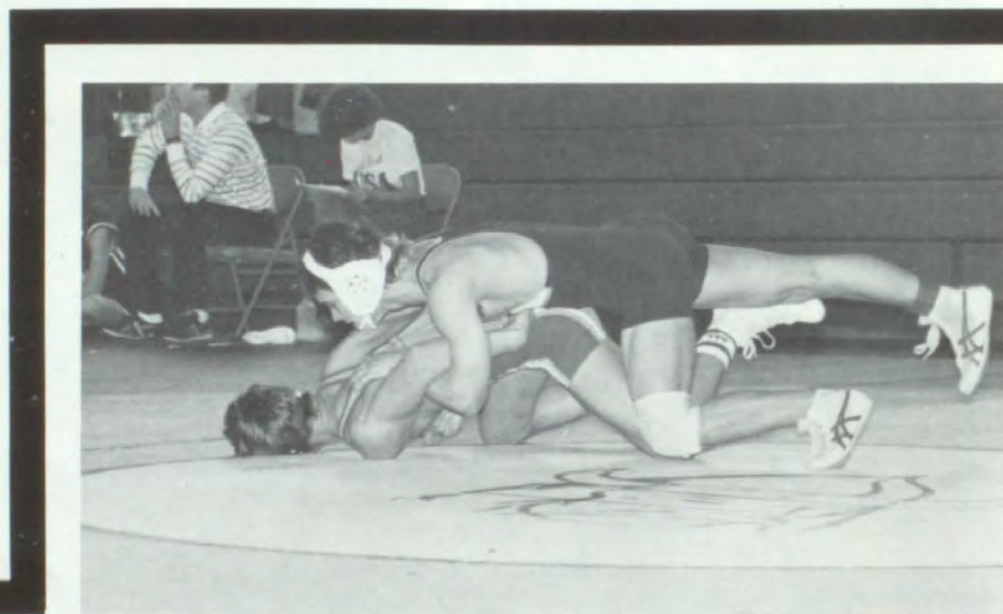

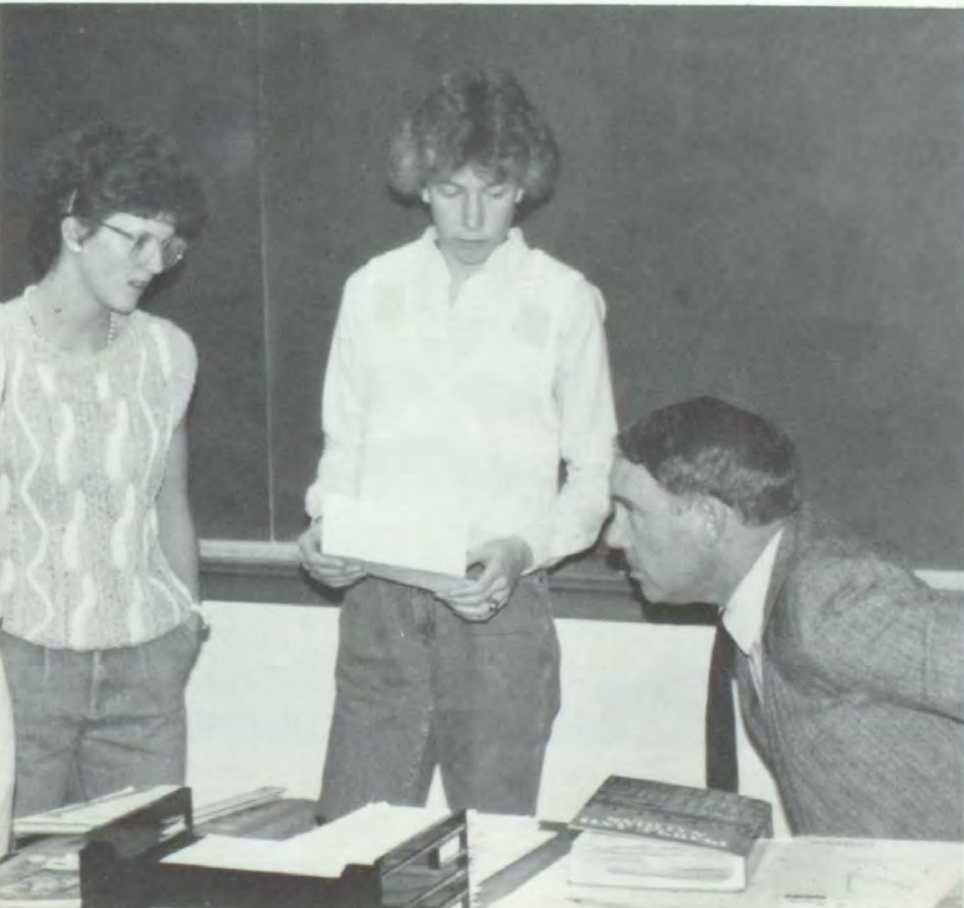

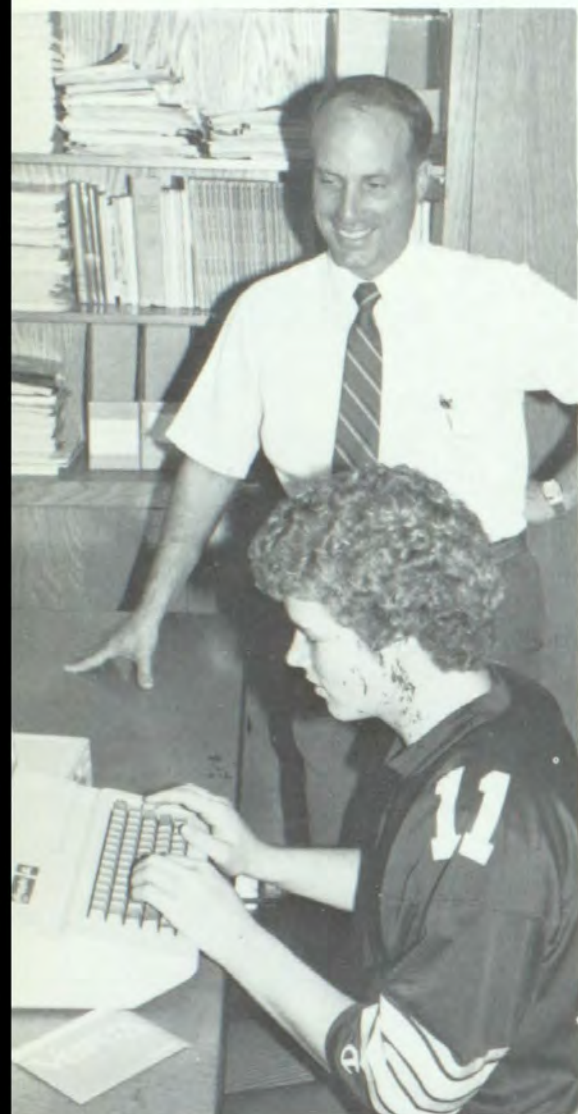
